

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Perseverance Opening

Lead the following discussion with the Cub Scouts:

Our Core Value for the month of June is “Perseverance”.

Who can tell me what they think “Perseverance” means? [They may need to have you pronounce the word a few times.]

[Cub Scouts may or may not have ideas of what “Perseverance” means. Integrate as many of their answers as possible while you make sure that they understand that **Perseverance means sticking with something and not giving up, even if it is difficult.**

How can a Cub Scout have perseverance?

[Listen to their responses and remind them to realize that they must continue to work hard in order to improve their skills in activities where they want to excel. If you need to, give some examples of people who have persevered.]

Alien Sticks

Materials:

Craft sticks (2 per Cub Scout)

Crayons/markers

Glue

Feathers

Googly eyes (2 per Cub Scout)

Instructions:

1. Using markers and/or crayons, color both sides of the two craft sticks.
2. On one end of the craft sticks, glue the craft sticks at an angle.



3. Once the glue is almost dry, glue two small feathers on either side of the craft sticks.
4. Once the last glue is almost dry, on one side of our craft sticks, glue the two googly eyes.



5. Come up with a name for your alien.

Keep the Satellite Up

Materials:

One large beach ball per group of 20 Cub Scouts

Instructions:

Scientists rely on gravity and inertia to keep satellites in orbit. Your task is to keep the satellite from falling to earth.

Cub Scouts make a circle and try to keep the beach ball (satellite) up in the air for as many hits as possible. Challenge the Cub Scouts to keep the satellite in the air for 20 orbits (hits) or 30 orbits (hits) or even a higher number of orbits.
