

Solar Systems

Materials:

Black construction paper (1 sheet per Cub Scout)

Yellow construction paper (½ sheet per Cub Scout)

Copies of Planet sheets

Copies of Solar system Circle templates 1 & 2 sheets

Brass brads (1 per Cub Scout)

Scissors

Glue

Crayons/Markers

Pencils

Push pins

Instructions:

1. Cut out the circles on the Solar System template sheets. Trace the circles onto the construction paper – the large circle goes on the black construction paper; the smaller circles is traced onto the yellow construction paper.

2. Cut out the traced circles.

3. Find the center of each colored circle. Poke a hole in the center of each circle. Put the yellow circle on top of the black circle, matching up the centers. Insert the brad in through the center of each of the circles.




4. Color all the planets on the Planet Sheet.






Cut out the planets and glue them on to the black circle. Cub Scouts can arrange them from the sun outward: Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune (Pluto is also included on the print out, although scientists no longer classify Pluto as a planet. Cub Scouts can decide if they would like to put it on their solar systems).



5. Cub Scouts can rotate the planets around the sun and watch them orbit. Help them to realize also that the sun is much much much bigger than the representation in this small paper solar system in comparison to the other planets.







Flying Transformations

Materials: None

Instructions:

Divide the boys into teams. The object of the game is for each team of Cub Scouts to form as quickly as possible into a human representation of the flying objects the leader names.

To play: Call out the name of a flying object; boys arrange themselves into that shape. For example, if you say “helicopter,” the boys must decide how to form rotor blades, landing skids, and a cockpit. Try the following objects: kite, bird, Wright brothers’ biplane, rocket, space shuttle, jet, zeppelin, balloon, etc

Variation for starting: You could first start with easier objects having to do with space – the moon, the sun, an asteroid, a star, etc. Until they get the hang of it and then do the flying objects mentioned above.
