Council Support

To keep you informed and provide updates to national and council advancement policies and guidelines, the **council advancement committee** meets with district advancement chairs four times per year :

- Key Leader Conference in January
- Council Coordinated meetings in April, August, and October.



Communication & Training

The **Key Leader Conference** breakout for district advancement committee members is considered “basic training” for your position.

Council Coordinated breakouts provide updates on what’s new that is important for you to know in your district position.

District Operations

There are four basic functions of the district:

- **Program** (which includes advancement)
- Unit service

Most of these committees include sub-committees, which may not exist at the district level.

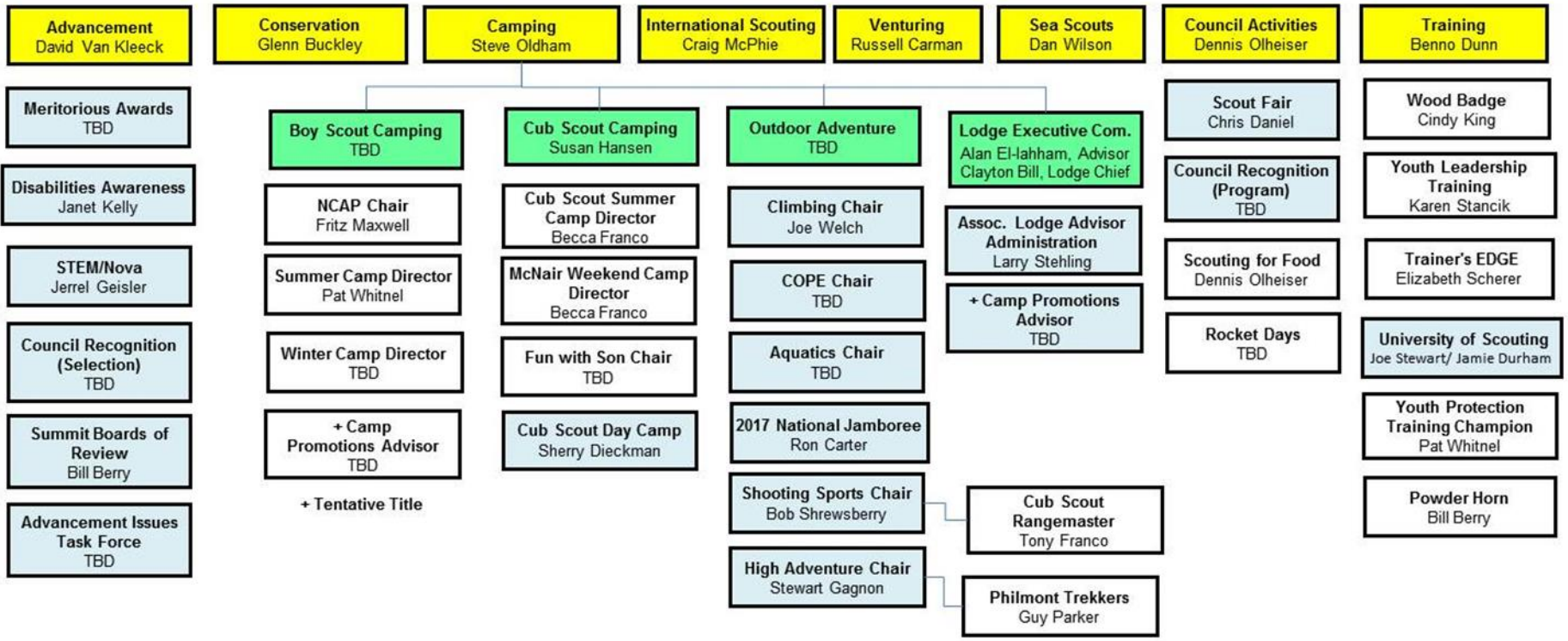

Purpose of Advancement

- Advancement is the process by which youth member progress from rank to rank in Scouting.
- Ranks are a means to an end.
- Advancement experiences should be designed to help Scouts have an exciting and meaningful experience



Purpose of Advancement

- Cub Scouting
- Boy Scouting
- Varsity Scouting
- Venturing
- Sea Scouting

Advancement is one of the **methods** of Scouting used to strengthen character, body, mind, and the qualities of participating citizenship.



Steps to Advancement

Cub Scouts

1. Preparation
2. Qualification
3. Recognition

Recognition

District Advancement Chair

As District Advancement Chair, you are a member of your district committee. To stay updated on and to pass along information about current policies and guidelines, you should attend these meetings:

- Monthly district committee meetings
- Tri-annual council coordinated meetings
- Annual key leader's conference
- Monthly roundtable meetings



District Advancement Chair

As District Advancement Chair, your responsibilities include:

- Keep the district program chair regularly informed of progress towards goals.
- Promote advancement at roundtable, district functions, unit meetings, district/unit websites, district email blasts, etc.
- Support local and national Scouting policy.



District Advancement Chair

As District Advancement Chair, your responsibilities include:

- Interpret and implement the advancement policies of both the national council and of the local council advancement policies
- Provide year-round training opportunities for units in the area of advancement



District Advancement Chair

As District Advancement Chair, your responsibilities include:

- Maintain a district merit badge counselor list that is updated annually and available for Scouts and units.
- Make sure that merit badge counselors are registered and approved for each merit badge they wish to counsel.



District Advancement Chair

As district advancement chair, your responsibilities include:

- Ensure that there is a district representative on every Eagle Scout board of review (BOR).
- Review and approve Eagle Scout service projects in accordance with council and national guidelines.



District Advancement Chair

As district advancement chair, your responsibilities include:

- Promote to troops, teams, crews, and ships that they conduct regular ceremonies to insure proper recognition of their youth
- Encourage packs to present advancement on a monthly basis through meaningful ceremonies at pack meetings.



District Advancement Chair

As district advancement chair, your responsibilities include:

- Work with unit leaders to help them better understand advancement and implementation of advancement in their units.
- Investigate and recommend youth and adult members for lifesaving and other special awards and recognition.



District Advancement Chair

As district advancement chair, your responsibilities include:

- Achieve satisfactory results in the percent of Scouts by program advancing during the year; monitor rank advancement progress throughout the year, identify those units with little or no advancement reported and arrange special assistance for such units as needed.



District Advancement Chair

As district advancement chair, your responsibilities include:

- In consultation with the council advancement committee, and according to guidelines outlined in the *Guide to Advancement*, act on appeals from Eagle Scout candidates if their troop denies their application or turns them down at the board of review.



District Advancement Chair

As district advancement chair, your responsibilities include:

- Consider and act on appeals for any Scout advancement issue, whether brought on by a unit, Scout leader, youth, parent, or other concerned adult.

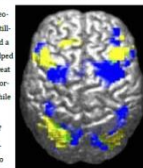
Enhancing Awareness

Serving ADHD Youth—Scouting Provides Structure and Focus

The mission of the Boy Scouts of America—to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law—has provided a structure, challenge, and an outdoor physical focus that have helped many boys succeed. For that reason, Scouting has long been a great program for youth who have Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), and for many, their successes have not just been while they are Scouts, but have continued throughout their lives.

Why is Scouting a great program for youth who have ADHD?

Part of all Scouting is a well-thought-out, highly structured program that provides a step-by-step sequence of skills for Scouts to master. It promotes fun, friendship, and adventure. Scouting offers frequent positive recognition and develops social skills and leadership skills. Scouting employs a leadership and training model, EDGE—Explain, Demonstrate, Guide, and Enable—which, through systematic
