# SHAC 17-2 . . . just around the corner!

## Course Preparations

The staff members of SHAC 17-2 have been hard at work the past several months preparing for your Wood Badge Experience. We look forward to your arrival on September 8th and pledge to make this a premier leadership training that is both meaningful and memorable.

## Arrival and Departure

On Friday, September 8th, you should plan to arrive at Camp Bovay McNair Adventure Camp by 7:30 A.M., well-rested and ready for a full day of activities. Please have breakfast before arrival. We will be camping in personal tents for weekend 1, so dress for the weather, as many of our activities will be outdoors. Wear proper footwear in anticipation of a half-mile hike.

Troop 1 will dismiss at approximately 5:00 P.M. on Sunday afternoon.

These questions are designed to help you formulate your thoughts as you begin to write your ticket. They will help you sort out what is important to you, what roles you play in Scouting and your life, and where you see yourself in the future.

Remember that your ticket is a very personal commitment that you write for yourself — a set of goals that you will pursue with the Scouting group that you work with. Begin now thinking about where you see that group in the future, how the group can make a greater impact in the lives of youth, and how you can help the group reach that vision.

## World Friendship Fund

Contributions also fund literature and leadership training to Scouting organizations in those countries who are in need.

A voluntary monetary collection for the World Friendship Fund will be taken during the second Wood Badge Weekend.

SHAC 17-2 Weekend 2 begins on October 6! The course will move to Tellepsen Scout Camp at Camp Bovay. Participants will be housed in their personal tents, and patrols will prepare their own meals.



## ACCOMMODATIONS: WEEKEND ONE

During the course you will be camping at a McNair Adventure Camp site in **personal** tents. All meals are prepared by the Camp Bovay staff and will be eaten in the dining hall.

## ITEMS TO BRING

**UNIFORM:** Be sure to wear a full, official field uniform for your Scouting program (shirt, pants, belt, socks) during the course. You will have an opportunity to wear an activity uniform (Scouting t-shirt), but a full official uniform will be normal dress the entire week at Wood Badge. *A troop neckerchief, slide, and cap will be provided.*

**BEDDING:** Personal cot, Pad/Air Mattress, Sleeping bag, Pillow

### ADDITIONAL ITEMS:

- Personal tent and tarp/ground cover for inside the tent
- Boots/shoes (2 pair) suitable for walking on uneven terrain
- Windbreaker or jacket appropriate to outdoor weather
- Rain gear (poncho or rain suit)
- Underwear, socks
- Handkerchiefs
- Medication in labeled containers
- Personal hygiene and toiletry items
- Towels and washcloths
- Sunscreen and Insect Repellent
- Personal First Aid Kit
- Flashlight with spare batteries and bulb
- Pocketknife or multiple tool-type knife. **(No fixed-blade knives)**
- Canteen or water bottle and re-usable cup
- Pen, pencils, pocket notebook
- Handbook for your Scouting program
- Daypack to carry personal items
- Camp Chair

### OPTIONAL ITEMS:

- Footwear for shower
- Sunglasses
- Religious book(s)

1. **BSA Annual Health and Medical Form**— Parts A, B and C are required for all participants and staff members, regardless of age. Part C requires a medical exam within one year of the start of the Wood Badge course. This must be mailed to Wayne McLeland and a copy brought to check-in.
2. **Participant Personal Resource Questionnaire**— Help us prepare for your Wood Badge experience.
3. **Dietary Restriction and Allergy Form**
4. **All fees are now due.** Scholarships funds may be available; requests should be made to Nathan Doherty, Program Director, at 713-598-4632.

## USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Electronic devices that could interrupt presentations or activities should be avoided and distractions kept to a minimum. Because we want you to have the full benefit of the Wood Badge experience, it is important to limit cell phone use to the time before the day starts, breaks, and after we retire for the day. The exception would be in the event of an emergency call from home.

## CHANGEABLE WEATHER CONDITIONS

While weather conditions may modify our inside and outside activities, the Wood Badge course will be held as planned. **Be Prepared for Weather!**

Each patrol will conduct two interim patrol meetings between the first and second weekends of the Wood Badge course. Please bring your calendar to assist your patrol in scheduling these meetings.

## DIRECTIONS TO CAMP BOVAY

### FROM HOUSTON:

- Travel 290 West toward Hempstead.
- Exit onto TX-6 N toward Bryan/College Station
- Continue on TX-6 N for 15.6 miles
- Turn RIGHT onto County Road 317
- Travel 1.9 miles, bear RIGHT onto the property
