be available at camp for you to fill out as requirements are completed. Each pack will be responsible for awarding the badge to each scout who earns it. Badges can be purchased at the council office.

One of the most requested elements of camp in years past has been more opportunity for advancements. Sessions will be planned to help both Cubs and Webelos to complete some of their requirements for activity badges or achievements. Each instructor will provide that information to parents and boys at their sessions. It will continue to be the
